PONDER POINT: GOD IS LOVE, PART 1

Paul's Conversion

Acts 9

Paul, also known as Saul, persecutes the church until He meets Jesus on the road to Damascus.

DID YOU KNOW?

Share these facts to get the conversation started.

- In Acts 9, after Christ met Paul on the road to Damascus, Paul found himself blinded for three days. He spent these days fasting and in prayer, meditating on what he had seen and heard.
- Blindness had huge social repercussions in the first century, especially to the Israelites. The Jews believed that most illnesses and deformities were the result of a sinful life. A Pharisee could not be blind; it would register him as unclean.
- Clearly, after this incident, Paul couldn't simply go back to his old life—his physical impediment wouldn't allow it. But it was his conversion to Christ, far more than his blindness, that kept him from returning to his former life.

CONNECT AS A FAMILY

Read **Acts 9:1–19**. Suggest that your children keep their eyes closed tightly as you read. When you've finished reading this part of The Big God Story, have your children open their eyes. Encourage them to share how they think Paul must have felt when all of a sudden, he couldn't see anything. Ask your children why they think Ananias might not have wanted to help Paul. What happened when Ananias obeyed God? Share together as a family the ways God's love changes how you think about things.

After reading the Scripture passage, discuss these questions together:

- Whom does God love?
- How does God show you His love?
- How can you show His love to others?

These questions can easily extend into the rest of the week. Look for opportunities to bring conversations about how God Is Love into your everyday life as a family.

REMEMBER VERSE

The Remember Verse focuses on a character trait of God that's highlighted in next week's portion of The Big God Story.
